
Together with the Irving community, Irving Cares helps residents who need temporary assistance and provides them with training that promotes self-sufficiency.

In keeping with our motto 'it's a hand up, not a hand out,' Irving Cares assistance recipients complete a Money Management course, which is available online in both English and Spanish.

## **Information and Referrals**

Case managers provided **8,814** referrals to **2,986** unduplicated households, an average of 3 per family. Referrals increased **18%** over the previous year.

## **Food Pantry**

Staffed solely by volunteers, the food pantry is open from 9 am to 3:30 pm Monday-Friday. 259,884 pounds of food donated

A 71% of the food pantry clients at Irving Cares answered "yes."
