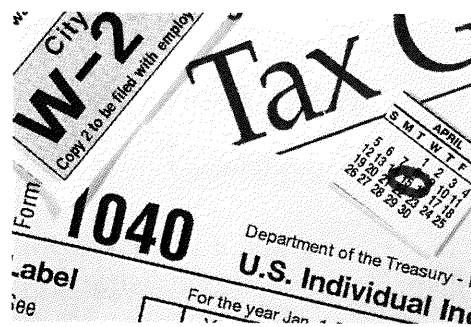

Prepare for Your Tax Prep Meeting

Before meeting a tax assistance volunteer, gather this information and bring it with you:

Basic Info:

Social Security Cards or ITIN Letters for everyone on the tax return

Your Photo ID

Bank information (routing and account numbers for direct deposit)

Last year's tax return (if available)

Your Documents (bring all that apply to you):

- Form W-2 – Wage and Tax Statement
- 1095 - Health Insurance Marketplace Statement or other proof of health insurance coverage
- Health Insurance Marketplace exemption certificate
- 1099-SSA - Social Security Benefit Statement
- 1099-MISC showing Miscellaneous Income
- 1099-R forms if you received a Pension or Annuity
- 1099-INT if you received Interest Income
- 1099-G if you received Unemployment Compensation
- 1099-DIV if you received Dividend Income
- 1098-T – Tuition Statement
- 1098-E – Student Loan Interest Statement
- W-2G – Certain Gambling Winnings
- *For Homeowners:* Form 1098 – Mortgage Interest Statement & Receipt showing real estate taxes paid

Your Records (bring all that apply to you):

- Child and dependent care expenses
- Education expenses
- Medical expenses
- Charitable expenses
- Retirement contributions
- *For Homeowners:* Receipts for energy-saving improvements on your home

If you are self-employed:

- Record of business expenses
- Record of business income
- Forms 1099-MISC
