Our Mission
Irving Cares provides focused assistance for Irving residents to address a financial crisis.

Government restrictions loosened around Covid-19, but the lingering effects of the pandemic continued into 2021-2022, proving to be a challenge for many families in Irving. Irving Cares and our dedicated staff responded with continued support of the community through our programs and services.

Financial Assistance



 **Rent Assistance**
199 Irving families received assistance with payments.
\$223,445 was provided to families.
Average rent bill paid was \$1,123.

 **Utility Assistance**
364 Irving families received assistance with gas and electric bills.
\$152,370 was provided to families.
Average utility bill paid was \$419.

 **Financial Coaching**
480 individuals participated in 1,440 hours of financial coaching to help them learn better skills in budgeting and savings.

 **Food Pantry**
Limits were changed so families may receive food up to nine times per year (vs. previous limit of six.) Since focus has shifted to programs there has been less demand for food assistance.

304 Irving families per month (on average) received nutritious groceries.

3,653 Irving families were assisted. Donations of funds and food enabled Irving Cares to distribute...

25,571 days of food for a total of **76,713** meals for Irving families.

 **Information & Referrals**
12,628 targeted referrals were made - in person and by phone - to other resources in order to provide clients the best services.

In recovery from Covid-19 environment, our main focus remained rent and utilities.

\$820,857.00
was spent on services -- specifically rent, utilities, food and education/employment to directly impact the lives of Irving residents in need.




